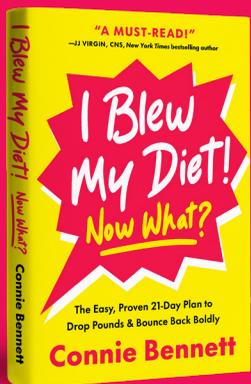




## Connie Bennett
